DFL is a non-profit organization devoted to improving the quality of life for veterans and non-veterans, through training service & hearing dogs and owning an off-leash dog park.

Service Dog Training

DFL specializes in task training dogs to help their owners 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, to lead a life of independence and self-reliance.



Veterans Training Veterans

Veterans and first responders volunteer in this program to train new dogs & clients through a series of workshops. Training is free of charge to the brave men and women who honorably served our country.

Service Dogs

Dogs are task trained to assist their owners with mobility challenges and psychological support.

Hearing Dogs

Dogs are task trained to alert their owners to a knock at the door, a telephone ring, a smoke alarm, or an alarm clock. Many other sounds can be added to meet a client's individual needs.

Administration and Training Center

In response to growing needs in our community and beyond, Dogs For Life constructed a 2,400 sq. ft. air-conditioned Assistance Dog Training Center at our 4 acre Off-Leash Dog Park at 1230 16th Avenue.



Off-Leash Dog Park

Memberships are available to the public. Dogs must be inoculated, neutered and social. Dog behavior evaluations and park orientations are scheduled by appointment and a \$100 fee is required. Walking trails, water and shaded oak trees are all a part of this safe and controlled environment.

Transition & Foster Training

DFL trains volunteers and has an in-home environment to help to rescue and train dogs year-round, which help to expand our Service Dog Program and increase the reach of our program.



Service Dogs for Veterans

Dogs For Life, Inc., is one of only five organizations in the State of Florida accredited by Assistance Dogs International, to certify service dogs for veterans, allowing them to receive additional VA benefits.

The fastest growing need for service dogs is in Florida, and from our veterans. Post 911 veterans prefer dogs to traditional treatments for the effects of post-traumatic stress.

231,000+ veterans of Afghanistan and Iraq already call Florida home¹.

80,000+ Iraq and Afghanistan veterans will retire to Florida in the next two years².

Florida is home to the highest number of amputees from the Gulf War-Era³.

According to the Veteran's Administration the news is grim for our new residents:

- 3 in 10 will have a service-related disability
- 20+ % will suffer from the effects of posttraumatic stress
- 50% of those with post-traumatic stress will not seek treatment
- 19% will report post-traumatic stress symptoms classified as "serious functional impairment"
